## Advice to Healthcare Professionals

The patient is at risk of immune-related side effects:

- Diarrhoea and Colitis
- Hepatotoxicities
- Pneumonitis
- Addisonian Crisis & other endocrinopathies
- Neuropathies
- Renal Toxicities
- Skin Rashes
- Cardiac Toxicity
- (this list is not exhaustive)

## Side effects of chemotherapy:

Neutropenia/neutropenic sepsis  
Anaemia/ thrombocytopenia  
Nausea/vomiting/diarrhoea

## Immuno-oncology Toxicity Management Guidelines:



Steroids are frequently indicated in the management of side effects and do not affect the efficacy of immunotherapy.

**PATIENT ADVICE:** If you feel unwell or develop any of the following signs or symptoms:

- A fever of 38°C or above
- Diarrhoea or blood/mucous in stools
- Increase in frequency of stools
- Shortness of breath or breathing difficulties
- New or worsening cough
- Yellowing of eyes or skin
- Stomach/abdominal pain or discomfort
- 2 episodes of 37.5°C or above within 30 minutes
- Nausea or vomiting
- Change in amount or colour of urine
- Extreme tiredness or muscle weakness
- Numbness or tingling in hands/feet
- Headache or blurred double vision
- Any new symptoms not normal for you

**Side effects can happen at anytime during treatment or after treatment has completed, so it is important to let your healthcare team know about any changes.**
